Pharmacist



A pharmacist checks and prepares the prescriptions for patients and provides people with the medicine they need when they are poorly. They need to know a lot about all the different medicines and be able to give advice to customers who come in to the pharmacy.

Nursery Teacher



A nursery teacher looks after and teaches young children who go to nursery. These young children are still learning lots of skills and need a lot of help with most things. The teachers need to decide which toys, games and activities to put out each day, look after the children in their care and keep the environment fun and safe.

Paramedic



A paramedic is called to the scene of an accident or emergency, when someone is injured or very ill. They might come in a car or in an ambulance and they will have lots of medical equipment with them. They need to try to find out what is wrong with the patient and decide how best to help.

Electrician



An electrician works with electric cables and electric appliances. When new buildings are built, such as houses or offices, the electric cables have to be put in safely. They need to know about the wiring for lights, computers, telephones, televisions, cookers and much more. They also use devices for measuring electric currents, such as ammeters and voltmeters.

Construction Worker



Construction workers use many different tools, such as concrete mixers, drills and hammers, and materials such as bricks, wood, cement and metal pipes. They clean and prepare building sites before construction and they have to follow plans to build things. They often have to operate machinery, such as diggers or cranes.

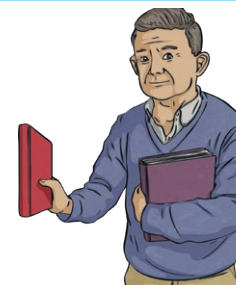

Chef



A chef plans the menus, buys the ingredients and prepares meals for other people. Chefs in busy restaurants need to make lots of meals at once. They need to know about measuring different ingredients, preparing different foods, cooking times and flavours that go well together. They have to use a variety of equipment, such as blenders, sharp knives and whisks.

Librarian



A librarian's role includes sorting books into categories, helping people find the information they need, answering questions, using computer systems to track books (including checking them in and out) and even providing story time sessions for young children. Knowing all about different authors and new book titles also helps.

Bank Manager



A bank manager is in charge of a bank and all the staff who work there. They will need to make sure that the customers who come to the bank are happy with the service they get. The bank manager needs to help people with borrowing money, saving money, different bank accounts and different currencies. They are responsible for the security of the money in the bank.

Video Game Designer



Video game designers usually have qualifications in computer science and often work as part of a team. They come up with ideas for games, including the plots, settings and characters. The designers have to consider what will be popular with their customers. They have to work with illustrators and programmers to create the games.

Car Sales Person



Someone who sells cars needs to understand a lot about the vehicles they are selling. They try to choose the best car for each customer, listening to what the customer wants and needs. They might take a customer out in a car to persuade them to buy it. They can also advise the customers about warranties on the cars they buy, which helps with repairs if anything goes wrong with the vehicle.

Musician



Most musicians start to learn to sing or play a musical instrument when they are young. Musicians can play in bands or in an orchestra. Most solo singers specialise in a particular style of music, such as rock, pop or reggae, though backing singers can have experience in various styles. Singers perform in a variety of locations, from pubs and festivals to cruise ships and theatres.
